







How do cats feel in the veterinary clinic?

TRAVEL TO THE VET practice

 Many cats don't like to be put in the carrier nor travelling by car, or in public transportation.

WAITING ROOM

- Cats like to live in a stable territory.
 Being suddenly removed from their territory is unsettling.
- Cats like routine and quietness. In the vet hospital, they are exposed to unfamiliar movements while in the carrier, new noises and strange smells.



CONSULTATION

- Cats perceive unfamiliar smells.
- Veterinary consultation involves non pleasant procedures which increase stress.

HOSPITALIZATION

- Cats do not like restraint and confinement.
- In an hospitalization room, stress is everywhere: a lot of noise and strangers lead to a sensory overload.
- Cats like to hide and cages do not allow this.
- High number of caretakers maintain high level of anxiety.

> Cats are stressed at every stage of the journey

What are the consequences for veterinary practice?



is a major obstacle to successful veterinary consultation



CLINICAL EXAMINATION

- Stress modifies:
 - heart rate
 - respiratory rate
 - blood pressure
 - various biochemistry parameters
- **Excessive restraint can** compromise clinical exam





RECOVERY

- Stress can cause:
 - anorexia
 - prostration
 - lack of grooming
 - excessive aggression
- Significant impairment on patient global outcome



STAFF MOTIVATION

- Stress in cats can cause:
 - injuries for the vets and nurses due to fractious cats
 - stress for the staff
 - demotivation due to poor patient recovery
- **Negative impact for** the veterinary team



CLIENT SATISFACTION

- Stress in cats can lead to:
 - stress in cat owners when seeing their cat stressed or restrained by vet staff
 - unsatisfaction of owners when seeing their cat in poor condition after hospitalization (lack of grooming and appetite⇒ stuck hair and loss of weight)
- Negative impact on owners' satisfaction and loyalty


What are feline pheromones? ➤ Cats' natural messages

Communication signals

- · molecules of lipidic nature
- emitted by one individual
- can affect the behaviour of the same or other individuals
 - → of the same species
 - → no effect on other species

Note:

Pheromones are not Hormones



Pheromones are naturally perceived by the vomeronasal organ, then exert a direct effect on the brain which leads to a specific behavior

The 3 main feline pheromones:

Facial area Feline Facial Pheromone (FFP) ("happy messages")

Territorial marking, comforting message in the environment



Foot pads Feline Interdigital Semiochemical ("territory messages")

Territorial marking, induces scratching behavior

Mammary area **Cat Appeasing Pheromone** ('harmony messages")

Promotes peaceful relationship between offspring and adult cats

Targeted use

- Advice cat owners to spray in carrier before coming to the clinic
- Spray on your consultation table

Advice to cat owners

TRAINING THE CAT

Carrier habituation:

- If possible, train the cat to do short trips in his carrier from young age
- Let the carrier out and visible a few days prior to vet visit

Travel preparation:

- Make the carrier comfortable and tempting for the cat by placing known object (toys) and a favorite blanket inside
- Spray **FELIWAY**® **CLASSIC** in the carrier upon the blanket
- Gently invite the cat to enter the carrier

GETTING THE CAT TO THE VET CLINIC

For a safe trip:

- Secure the carrier in the car with the seat belt or by placing the carrier on the floor

HOW TO USE?

- Plug into the waiting room
- Leave the diffuser switched on continuously
- Avoid plugging in the diffuser under shelves, behind doors, behind curtains, behind furniture, as it will not work
- Renew refill every month

How to create a feline friendly waiting room

- Feline spots:
 - If possible provide a specific area for cats (separated from dogs)
 - Cats will feel safer on an elevated surface: provide shelfs, chairs to wait
- Comfortable environment:
 - Plug in **FELIWAY®** *CLASSIC* **Diffuser** to release constantly reassuring messages (Feline Facial Pheromone)
 - → FFP is only perceived by cats and will not affect dogs or any other species coming to the vet clinic

Clinical Evidence


Methods

- 87 cats during routine consultation
- FELIWAY® CLASSIC or placebo, sprayed on the vet clinic table
- Cat's behaviour & handling assessed after a 15-min examination

- If needed, respray after 4 to 5 hours


